FY24 INTERNAL EPAS AUDIT RESULTS

On 4-7 March 2024, Fort Novosel successfully completed another Internal EPAS Audit! Two teams assessed the status of Fort Novosel's environmental program by using USAACE Form 2717, Compliance Inspection Checklist. Of the 25 locations that were assessed, 11 organizations had no findings! The two teams identified a total of 40 compliance findings. 24 of these were Class I findings and 16 were Class III findings. Class I findings are violations against current federal or state regulations and Class III findings are violations against a DoD, Army or Fort Novosel requirements. There were 3 repeat findings as compared to the FY22 External EPAS, focusing on Solid Waste, POL and Pest Management. For more details, see the graphs and descriptions of the findings on this page. 
Hazardous Waste Findings:

- Improper storage of batteries/not segregated
- Waste characterization
- Inadequate inspection checklist
- Potentially hazardous or regulated waste being disposed of in general refuse

POL Findings:

- SPCC training
- Missing required form
- Obsolete version of forms
- SPCC inspections
- Spills
- Improper venting of diesel fuel storage tank
- Open and improperly covered ports on a storage tank
- AST interstitial gauge damaged or in poor condition
