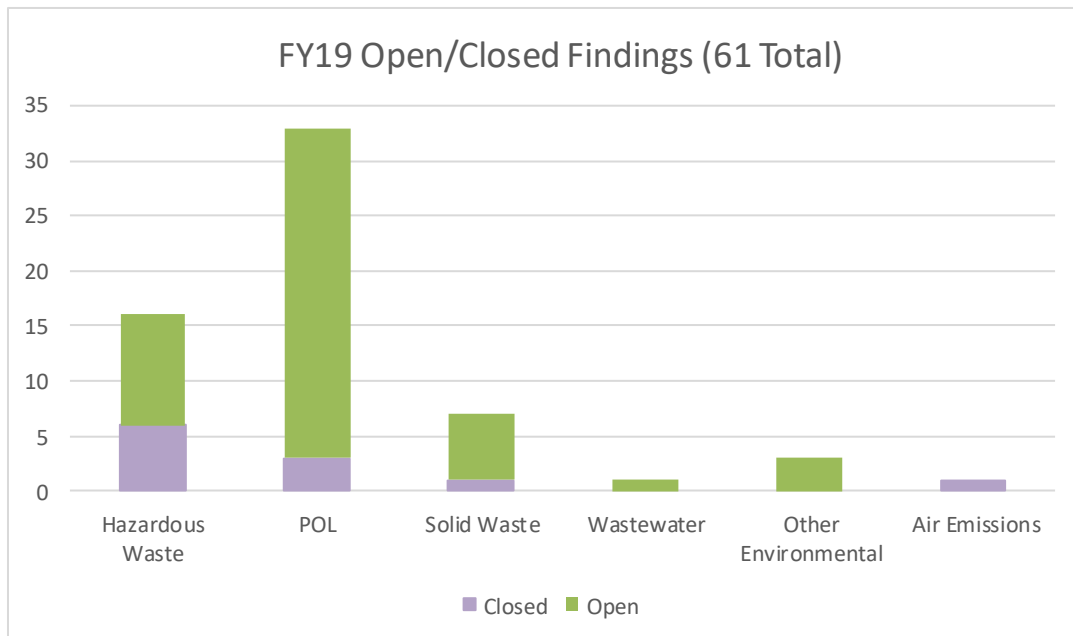

## FY19 Internal EPAAS Audit Findings

Fort Rucker has successfully completed another Internal EPAAS Audit! On 10–13 June, three teams assessed the status of Fort Rucker’s environmental program using USAACE Form 2717, Compliance Inspection Checklist. This resulted in a total of 61 compliance findings with the majority dealing with POL. These 61 findings were also categorized into 47 Class I findings and 14 Class III findings. Class I findings are violations against current federal or state regulations and Class III findings are violations against a DoD, Army, or Fort Rucker requirement. The graph below shows all open and closed findings for each media. Organizations are required to submit their Corrective Action Plans to DPW Environmental by 1 August 2019.

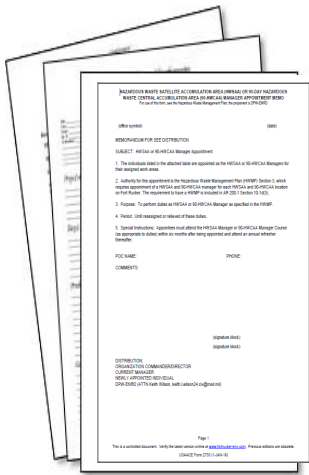

## New GC Policy Memo 19-23:

### Discontinue the Use of Reconditioned Absorbents

On 26 APR 19 the Garrison approved discontinuing the use of all reconditioned absorbents including rags, wipes, towels, absorbent pads, socks and booms. This was due to the potential risk associated with contaminants found to be in the absorbents. Any reconditioned absorbents currently onsite, should be turned into the HMCC for proper handling and disposal. Organizations should purchase disposable absorbents and manage them according to instruction provided by the DPW-ENRD Hazardous Waste Manager.
